Student Engagement and Wellbeing Policy

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all students and members of our school community understand:

- (a) our commitment to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for students
- (b) expectations for positive student behaviour
- (c) support available to students and families
- (d) our school's policies and procedures for responding to inappropriate student behaviour.

Bona Vista Primary School has a commitment to zero tolerance of child abuse. We support and respect all students. We are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, the cultural safety of children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for children with a disability, in line with the Child Safe Standards.

Auburn Primary School is committed to providing a safe, secure and stimulating learning environment for all students. We understand that students reach their full potential only when they are happy, healthy and safe, and that a positive school culture helps to engage students and support them in their learning. Our school acknowledges that student wellbeing and student learning outcomes are closely linked.

The objective of this policy is to support our school to create and maintain a safe, supportive and inclusive school environment consistent with our school's values.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all school activities, including camps and excursions.

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POLICY

SCHOOL PROFILE

Bona Vista Primary School is a small school with a proud history of educational excellence since its establishment in 1909. It is a dynamic primary school situated in a beautiful rural setting, only 5 minutes from the centre of Warragul.

At Bona Vista our main goal is to foster a love of learning that prepares students to become lifelong learners and develop the skills to become well-rounded and successful citizens of the future. We believe in educating the whole child, academically, socially and emotionally.

We highly value a strong home/ school relationship, through effective communication and many opportunities for families to contribute to our school community.

Our staff and students are very welcoming and friendly. Student engagement is real at Bona Vista and we genuinely love our school and our community. Students are involved in learning that is meaningful, exciting and innovative. We provide strategies and social programs to assist all students to become confident, resilient and independent.

Bona Vista Primary School has large, well maintained play areas including a tennis/ basketball court, adventure playground, oval, cubby and 2 sandpits. We have two open learning classrooms, a large sports shed with organised equipment, a spacious multipurpose room, library, office/ administration, a sensory garden, a vegetable garden and chooks.

We provide a supportive, safe and engaging learning environment so that all students can achieve their individual goals. At Bona Vista we will work together for the best outcomes for your child. Staff are dedicated and approachable, always striving to deliver quality programs and take the time to learn the unique abilities of each child.

At Bona Vista we:



maintain lower class sizes to cater for individual learning needs and abilities,



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provide a safe, caring and stimulating learning environment,



celebrate student learning in a variety of ways,



provide a wide range of opportunities and resources that reflect the goals and priorities of our school,



ensure that our parents and volunteers feel welcome and contribute to the school in a meaningful and engaging way.

1. SCHOOL VALUES, PHILOSOPHY AND VISION

Bona Vista Primary School's Statement of Values and School Philosophy is integral to the work that we do and is the foundation of our school community. Students, staff and members of our school community are encouraged to live and demonstrate our core values of Respect, Responsibility, Resilient, Safe and Active Learner at every opportunity.

Our school's vision is to provide a safe, inclusive and engaging learning environment that enables all students to achieve their full potential.

Our mission is to offer an education that strives for academic excellence and provide an inclusive, balanced learning program, rich in experiences. The school will provide opportunities for each student to become confident and responsible global citizen, meeting challenges and embracing opportunities of our changing world.

The values of Respect, Resilient, Honest and Care are seen as being central to the life of our school and how all members of the school community should conduct themselves. As a school we attempt to apply these in our everyday dealings with each other and in the development of our programs and policies.

2. ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES

Bona Vista Primary School endeavours to promote a healthy, supportive and secure environment for all students and to raise awareness of what makes students resilient; to develop strategies to reduce vulnerabilities and increase coping skills. Our school is a positive environment in which all teachers assume responsibility for student wellbeing, endeavouring to provide successful experiences for all children; where they feel safe and secure in a supportive environment and where a sense of belonging and wellbeing are strengthened.



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Bona Vista Primary School has developed a range of strategies to promote engagement, positive behaviour and respectful relationships for all students in our school. We acknowledge that some students may need extra social, emotional or educational support at school, and that the needs of students will change over time as they grow and learn.

A summary of the universal (whole of school), targeted (year group specific) and individual engagement strategies used by our school is included below:

Whole School

- high and consistent expectations of all staff, students and parents and carers
- prioritise positive relationships between staff and students, recognising the fundamental role this plays in building and sustaining student wellbeing
- creating a culture that is inclusive, engaging and supportive
- welcoming all parents/carers and being responsive to them as partners in learning
- analysing and being responsive to a range of school data such as attendance, Attitudes to School Survey, parent survey data, student management data and school level assessment data teachers at Example School use an gradual release of responsibility
- teachers at Bona Vista Primary School use DET's instructional framework to ensure an explicit, common and shared model of instruction to ensure that evidenced-based, high yield teaching practices are incorporated into all lessons
- teachers at Bona Vista Primary School adopt a broad range of teaching and assessment approaches to effectively respond to the diverse learning styles, strengths and needs of our students and follow the standards set by the Victorian Institute of Teaching
- our school's Statement of Values are incorporated into our curriculum and promoted to students, staff and parents so that they are shared and celebrated as the foundation of our school community
- carefully planned transition programs to support students moving into different stages of their schooling
- positive behaviour and student achievement is acknowledged in the classroom, and formally in school assemblies and communication to parents
- monitor student attendance and implement attendance improvement strategies at a whole-school, cohort and individual level
- create opportunities for cross—age connections amongst students through school plays, athletics, music programs and peer support programs



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- we engage in school wide positive behaviour support with our staff and students, which includes programs such as:
 - Bully Stoppers
 - Circle Time
 - Buddy program
 - Zones of Regulation
 - Student leadership positions and roles of responsibility
 - opportunities for student inclusion (i.e. sports teams, electives)

Targeted

- All Koorie students have an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) which contains explicit goals and tracks their learning progress throughout the year through termly Student Support Group Meetings and connection with the Koorie Engagement Support Officer
- all students in Out of Home Care will be appointed a Learning Mentor, have an Individual Learning Plan and will be referred to Student Support Services for an Educational Needs Assessment
- Students with severe or challenging behaviours are supported through the development of Positive Behaviour Management Plans and regular Care Team Meetings with parents, staff and allied health professionals.
- staff will undertake health promotion and social skills development in response to needs identified by student wellbeing data, classroom teachers or other school staff each year
- staff will apply a trauma-informed approach to working with students who have experienced trauma

Individual

Bona Vista Primary School implements a range of strategies that support and promote individual engagement. These can include:

- building constructive relationships with students at risk or students who are vulnerable due to complex individual circumstances
- meeting with student and their parent/carer to talk about how best to help the student engage with school
- developing an Individual Learning Plan and/or a Behaviour Support Plan



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- considering if any environmental changes need to be made, for example changing the classroom set up
- referring the student to:
 - school-based wellbeing supports
 - Student Support Services
 - Appropriate external supports such as council based youth and family services, other allied health professionals, headspace, child and adolescent mental health services or Orange Door

Where necessary the school will support the student's family to engage by:

- being responsive and sensitive to changes in the student's circumstances and health and wellbeing
- collaborating, where appropriate and with the support of the student and their family, with any external allied health professionals, services or agencies that are supporting the student
- monitoring individual student attendance and developing an Attendance Improvement Plans in collaboration with the student and their family
- running regular Student Support Group meetings for all students:
 - with a disability
 - in Out of Home Care
 - and with other complex needs that require ongoing support and monitoring.

3. IDENTIFYING STUDENTS IN NEED OF SUPPORT

Bona Vista Primary School is committed to providing the necessary support to ensure our students are supported intellectually, emotionally and socially. The Student Wellbeing team plays a significant role in developing and implementing strategies help identify students in need of support and enhance student wellbeing. Bona Vista Primary School will utilise the following information and tools to identify students in need of extra emotional, social or educational support:

- personal, health and learning information gathered upon enrolment and while the student is enrolled
- attendance records
- academic performance
- observations by school staff such as changes in engagement, behaviour, self-care, social connectedness and motivation
- attendance, detention and suspension data



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- engagement with families
- self-referrals or referrals from peers

4. STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

All members of our school community have a right to experience a safe and supportive school environment. We expect that all students, staff, parents and carers treat each other with respect and dignity. Our school's Statement of Values highlights the rights and responsibilities of members of our community.

Students have the right to:

- participate fully in their education
- feel safe, secure and happy at school
- learn in an environment free from bullying, harassment, violence, discrimination or intimidation
- express their ideas, feelings and concerns.

Students have the responsibility to:

- participate fully in their educational program
- display positive behaviours that demonstrate respect for themselves, their peers, their teachers and members of the school community
- respect the right of others to learn.

Students who may have a complaint or concern about something that has happened at school are encouraged to speak to their parents or carers and approach a trusted teacher or a member of the school leadership team.

5. STUDENT BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

Behavioural expectations of students, staff and families are grounded in our school's Statement of Values. Student bullying behaviour will be responded to consistently with our school's Bullying policy.

When a student acts in breach of the behaviour standards of our school community, Bona Vista Primary School will institute a staged response, consistent with the Department's Student Engagement and Inclusion Guidelines. Where appropriate, parents



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will be informed about the inappropriate behaviour and the disciplinary action taken by teachers and other school staff.

Disciplinary measures may be used as part of a staged response to inappropriate behaviour in combination with other engagement and support strategies to ensure that factors that may have contributed to the student's behaviour are identified and addressed. Disciplinary measures at our school will be applied fairly and consistently. Students will always be provided with an opportunity to be heard.

Disciplinary measures that may be applied include:

- warning a student that their behaviour is inappropriate
- teacher controlled consequences such as moving a student in a classroom or other reasonable and proportionate responses to misbehaviour
- withdrawal of privileges
- Withdrawal of invitation to attend extra curricular activities outside the school gates
- Referral Principal
- restorative practices
- behaviour reviews
- suspension
- expulsion

Suspension and expulsion are measures of last resort and may only be used in particular situations consistent with Department policy, available at:

Corporal punishment is prohibited in our school and will not be used in any circumstance.

6. ENGAGING WITH FAMILIES

Bona Vista Primary School values the input of parents and carers, and we will strive to support families to engage in their child's learning and build their capacity as active learners. We aim to be partners in learning with parents and carers in our school community.

We work hard to create successful partnerships with parents and carers by:



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- ensuring that all parents have access to our school policies and procedures, available on our school website or by contacting the school office
- maintaining an open, respectful line of communication between parents and staff, supported by our Communicating with School Staff policy.
- providing parent volunteer opportunities so that families can contribute to school activities
- involving families with homework and other curriculum-related activities
- involving families in school decision making
- coordinating resources and services from the community for families
- including families in Student Support Groups, and developing individual plans for students.

7. EVALUATION

Bona Vista Primary School will collect data each year to understand the frequency and types of wellbeing issues that are experienced by our students so that we can measure the success or otherwise of our school based strategies and identify emerging trends or needs.

Sources of data that will be assessed on an annual basis include:

- Student survey data
- Incidents data
- School reports
- Parent survey
- Case management
